Fund Manager Commentary

Fund Highlights

Market Recap

Municipal bond markets faced significant challenges in the first half of 2025, characterized by underperformance relative to other fixed income sectors. Despite a broadly favorable environment for U.S. Treasuries, municipal bonds lagged due to several key factors including policy uncertainty, substantial supply pressures, and pronounced volatility stemming from an April market sell-off. Investor sentiment deteriorated further with periodic and unpredictable fund outflows and ETF liquidations exacerbating negative returns.

Municipal AAA General Obligation (GO) yields showed varied changes, with significant curve steepening evident. Front-end yields marginally decreased, while the long-end notably increased, with 30-year yields rising by 26 basis points. Credit spreads widened modestly across all categories, reflecting investor caution due to historically tight valuations. Elevated issuance levels, anticipated to exceed \$300 billion year-to-date, further strained the market as retail investors and funds showed cautious demand, while institutional interest favored other asset classes due to reduced effective tax rates. This structural change within the municipal market contributed to continued bear-steepening in the yield curve, particularly in the 10s30s range.

Portfolio Review

The Touchstone Core Municipal Bond Fund (Class A Shares, Load Waived) outperformed its benchmark, the Bloomberg Municipal Bond Index, for the quarter ended June 30, 2025.

The Fund's relative performance versus its benchmark reflected a balance of strategic positioning and market-driven challenges. The Fund's deliberate overweight to single A credits detracted from performance as credit spreads widened. However, strategic selection in security-specific opportunities helped offset these negative impacts. By carefully selecting credits with strong fundamentals and favorable risk-reward profiles, we were able to navigate the challenges presented by tight spreads and sector-specific pressures. This targeted approach has allowed the Fund to maintain stability and capitalize on value opportunities where available, ensuring resilience in a complex market.

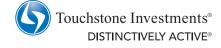
Throughout the quarter, we actively adjusted the Fund's positioning to navigate tight sector valuations. The Fund maintained sector neutrality, apart from an overweight in prepaid gas bonds, and selectively rotated out of richly valued state GO, airport, and smaller healthcare credits. Investments were strategically reallocated towards local GO issuers with more compelling valuations and stable fundamentals.

Duration positioning remained largely neutral versus the benchmark, allowing natural adjustments while closely monitoring yield dynamics. While municipal yields helped narrowly avert negative returns, we stand ready to extend duration if yields see a meaningful upward move, guided by our neutral outlook around a 4.30% 10-year yield.

The Fund's barbell strategy marginally detracted from performance due to yield curve steepening; however, the increased curve attractiveness enhances future potential for longer maturity investments.

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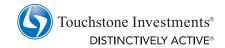

Outlook and Conclusion

We remain cautiously optimistic about municipal bond valuations, particularly favoring long-dated maturities given current market dynamics. Although a moderate decrease in issuance is anticipated in the second half of 2025, ongoing supply-demand pressures may sustain short-term volatility. The market could experience a seasonal rally towards yearend, yet municipal bonds may continue to trail other fixed income alternatives.

The Fund's positioning reflects this outlook, emphasizing a nimble approach to duration and yield curve adjustments. We continue to target opportunities selectively, maintaining an overweight in prepaid gas bonds and seeking value in local government issues. We also recommend strategically extending duration, should 30-year Treasury yields rise above 5%, viewing this as an optimal entry point to enhance long-term performance.
