Fund Highlights

- Invests in equities believed to be developing solutions for net-zero emissions and companies that can benefit from positive changes in climate transition processes.
- Seeks companies that may benefit from climate transition impacts; solution providers; transition leaders and adaptation opportunities.
- Expands beyond solution providers inclusive of transition and adaptation companies accessing a wide opportunity set for potential outperformance.

Market Recap

Global financial markets rebounded sharply in the second quarter 2025, overcoming volatility tied to the Trump administration's April 2nd tariff announcements and ongoing trade tensions. Many tariffs have been paused or scaled back to allow for negotiations. The Federal Reserve signaled likely rate cuts by year-end, noting earlier action was delayed by tariff and inflation uncertainty. Encouragingly, inflation declined from 3.0% in January to 2.4% in May. The labor market remained strong, with unemployment steady at 4.1% in June.

Internationally, developed markets (U.K., Japan, EU) posted sub-2% GDP growth in both the first and second quarters, while India and other emerging markets saw stronger gains. U.S. growth outpaced peers, but the U.S. Dollar Index dropped over 10% year-to-date amid a widening fiscal deficit.

Equity markets surged in the second quarter, with the U.S. equities up double-digits driven by a rebound in the Magnificent 7 technology stocks and renewed artificial intelligence (AI) enthusiasm. Growth outperformed Core and Value across all capitalizations. Mid cap growth led topping large cap growth due to favorable valuations and earnings potential. International equities also rallied, aided by a weaker dollar and broad strength in Europe—particularly Germany and the U.K. Emerging markets generated a strong gain, led by Taiwan, South Korea, and India, on improved sentiment and easing trade tensions.

Portfolio Review

The Touchstone Climate Transition ETF (NAV) outperformed its benchmark, the MSCI World Index, for the quarter ended June 30, 2025.

The Fund's outperformance was driven by strong stock selection. The top contributors included Vertiv Holdings Co. (data center

infrastructure and energy efficiency solutions), which nearly doubled over the quarter; Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company (leading semiconductor foundry enabling energy efficient computing), and MasTec Inc. (infrastructure engineering and construction focused on power and telecoms). All these names highlight the markets ongoing focus on the need to efficiently power AI workstreams. On the downside, Enphase Energy Inc. (solar microinverters and energy storage) declined given a roll back on supportive policy in the U.S.; Thermo Fisher Scientific Inc. (scientific instruments and diagnostics) also suffered from weakness in the government research market and Copart, Inc. (vehicle auction platform enabling recycling) saw the market concerned regarding a potential new entrant which we feel overlooks Copart's compelling moat.

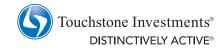
Over the quarter, the key development to highlight has been our broadening of exposure to the powering AI thematic with new names such as Vertiv purchased during the April weakness. Vertiv is a key player in the liquid cooling market a key driver of efficiency in data centers. Elsewhere we reallocated our materials exposure increasing our quality in our copper exposure with Antofagasta plc. From a renewables perspective we also moved from the rooftop market to utility scale where we see a more stable growth environment for the next few years with First Solar, Inc. our key exposure.

Outlook and Conclusion

In 2024, as the inflation battle seemed over, countries began to move towards more accommodative monetary policies, with rate cuts across key economies, with the exception of Japan. The narrative of a soft landing in the U.S. is starting to take shape, as well as a potential recovery in Europe and China. This would favor

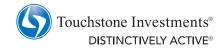




a broadening of the equity market performance into 2025 and beyond, after having been concentrated in a narrow set of stocks since 2020.

Many of our themes were left behind and encountered cyclical headwinds, such as clean-energy-related themes, which have seen a decline of over 20% for two years in a row. Despite these nearterm headwinds, we believe that the structural trends we focus on are firmly established. Looking ahead into 2025, we identify several attractive opportunities that are unduly overlooked and could regain investors' attention.

Overall, our portfolio adheres to the principles of strong quality growth while maintaining disciplined valuation. With our dedicated sustainability research team encompassing system changes across sectors, we are confident that the Fund is well-positioned to capture investment opportunities arising from a society transitioning to net zero, becoming more nature-positive and socially equitable. This provides investors with a diverse range of growth opportunities.
