Fund Highlights

- Primarily invests in income producing securities including corporate debt securities, mortgage-related securities, asset backed securities, government securities (both U.S. government securities and foreign sovereign debt), public equities and preferred stocks
- Invests at least 50% of the portfolio in investment-grade rated securities
- Expanded opportunity set provides the flexibility to react to market dislocations
- Broadly diversified by sector, resulting in multiple sources of return potential and low correlation to traditional asset classes
- Duration management is used as a risk mitigation tool; seeks to avoid taking large duration positions due to the difficulty in predicting interest rates
- Active management and security selection are focused on building a high conviction portfolio

Market Recap

Economic growth remained resilient through the first half of 2026, supported by AI driven capital investment and solid consumer spending, with U.S. GDP expected to remain near 2% over the coming quarters. Although Middle East tensions temporarily pushed oil prices higher, easing geopolitical risks helped stabilize energy markets by quarter-end. Inflation is expected to remain above 3%, prompting new Federal Reserve Chair Kevin Warsh to maintain a restrictive policy stance and emphasize price stability while reducing forward guidance, increasing uncertainty around the future path of interest rates.

Despite persistent inflation, the labor market remained healthy, with unemployment declining to 4.2% and payroll growth improving, though wage gains continued to lag inflation for many households. Equity markets rallied sharply, with the S&P 500 gaining more than 15% and the Russell 2000 advancing over 21%, while tighter credit spreads reflected strong investor risk appetite. In fixed income, expectations for higher policy rates pushed two-year Treasury yields meaningfully higher, while longer-term yields rose more modestly.

Portfolio Review

The Touchstone Strategic Income Fund (Class A Shares, Load Waived) outperformed its benchmark, the Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index, for the quarter ended June 30, 2026.

Sector allocation was the primary driver of relative outperformance, led by overweight allocations to high yield corporates and emerging market debt as credit spreads tightened. Security selection also added value, with strong issuer

selection in investment grade corporates, particularly utilities, banking, and technology, and an overweight to non-agency securitized sectors, including commercial mortgage backed securities (CMBS), and asset backed securities (ABS).

Interest rate positioning modestly contributed to relative performance as the Fund maintained a shorter duration than the benchmark and tactically adjusted duration as rates rose. Inflation concerns and the Federal Reserve's (Fed) renewed focus on price stability pushed the 2-year Treasury yield 38 basis points higher, while longer-term yields rose more modestly. Although tactical yield curve positioning modestly detracted from results, the Fund ended the quarter with a largely neutral curve stance relative to the benchmark.

The Fund's portfolio positioning changed little during the quarter as the team remained focused on bottom-up security selection while opportunistically trimming high yield exposure. The Fund maintained duration near the upper end of its historical range, averaging 5.5 years versus 5.9 years for the benchmark, and utilized Treasury Inflation-Protected Securities (TIPS) to manage shifting inflation expectations.

Outlook and Conclusion

The Fund maintains a modest overweight risk posture, reflecting a 30% risk budget, as current credit valuations remain expensive relative to historical levels despite a stable macroeconomic backdrop. Fund positioning was largely unchanged during the quarter, with investment grade credit emphasizing high-quality financials, utilities, and selective relative value opportunities, while securitized exposure continues to favor non-agency ABS, CMBS and residential mortgage backed securities. High yield and

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emerging market debt allocations remain toward the lower end of their historical ranges, reflecting tight spreads and a preference to preserve capacity to add risk should valuations become more attractive.

The Fund continues to manage duration tactically, ending the quarter at 5.7 years after averaging 5.5 years, with a bias toward the upper end of its target range. Elevated uncertainty

surrounding trade policy, geopolitics, inflation, and monetary policy is expected to keep interest rate volatility high, which may create opportunities for active duration management. In this environment, the Fund is positioned to benefit from modestly higher credit exposure than the benchmark while maintaining flexibility to increase risk during periods of market weakness, with bottom-up security selection remaining a key driver of excess return across market environments.

A Word About Risk
